Loup Power employees heading south to aid Florida utilities impacted by Hurricane Irma

COLUMBUS, Neb. — Fourteen Loup Power District employees will head south early Saturday morning to aid Florida utilities impacted by Hurricane Irma this weekend.

They will travel to Lincoln and join with crews from Lincoln Electric System and City of Grand Island before making their way to Paducah, Ky., by Saturday evening. The crews will stay in Montgomery, Ala., on Sunday evening.

Workers will stay out of danger until the hurricane has passed, but will be close by to aid with power restoration efforts.

Loup has committed its employees for two weeks.

The American Public Power Association and Florida Municipal Power Agency are coordinating the power relief efforts.
