Loup Power Delivers Quarterly Lease Payments

COLUMBUS, Neb. —Loup Power District officials recently presented quarterly lease payment checks totaling more than \$900,000 to area communities.

The payments represent 10 percent of the retail revenue generated by the sale of electric power in the communities for the second quarter of 2017.

The payments were: Columbus — \$832,038.14; Genoa — \$16,572.08; Creston — \$5,152.92; Lindsay — \$38,791.67; and Newman Grove — \$14,164.74.

Each of these communities owns their electric distribution systems. These payments compensate them for the use of those systems. Communities use the funds for a variety of public projects.
